Scholarship Program

The 2017-18 Most Valuable Student (MVS) Scholarship program has been completed. Staunton Elk Lodge #351 had twenty students recognized as part of the MVS competition. As required by the new rules of the MVS scholarship program, all local applicants submitted their Most Valuable Scholarship applications on-line and were initially judged and scored on the national level. Once the student's applications were ranked, each of the local Elk lodge's judging committee members were given up to eighty (80) points to add to each student's total based on their interpretation of the student's academic performance, essay, leadership, financial need and community involvement. Upon completion of the local judging which added to the initial scores from the national scoring, the three top male and the three top female applications were sent on to district/state competition based on their combined scores.

The Staunton Elk Lodge Board of Trustees voted on a request by the Scholarship Chair to award scholarships to the applicants based on their combined scores from both the national and local add on scores. awards ranged from \$300.00 to \$5 Where possible, the scholarship check award was presented to the student at their school's award program in front of their parents and other award winning students. The total local dollar support for the 2017-2018 Staunton Lodge #351 MVS local scholarship program is \$7,600.

A special thanks is given to the local judges; Roger Monger, Steve Claffey and Pete Pekala. They reviewed and judged each student's application and added the quality points to the national score which could have ultimately determined which students moved on to state/district competition and the amount of the local award. They did an outstanding job in a very quick turnaround time frame in the month of December.

Staunton Elks Lodge Legacy Scholarships

Staunton Elk lodge #351 had two Legacy scholarship applicants; Beverley (Bess) Wood (Riverheads High School) and Eston Garber (Robert E. Lee). Bess is the daughter of Jeff and Kim Wood. Eston is the son of R. Scott and Tonya Garber and the grandson of both Ronald and Eva Garber and Diana and Dickie Craig. Eston will be attending Virginia Tech majoring in Veterinary Science and Bess will be attending University of Virginia majoring in Biomedical Engineering in fall. The lodge was notified that both Bess and Eston were awarded State Elk Legacy Scholarships of \$4,000 each (\$1,000 per year). Staunton Elk Lodge #351's two Legacy applicants were awarded two of the four Legacy scholarships for Virginia. There were only two hundred and fifty (250) Legacy awards nationwide awarded by the Elk National Foundation. Congratulations to both Bess and Eston for outstanding high school careers and best wishes for continued success as they enter college in the fall.

The total scholarship support for 2017-18, includes \$7600 local funds and \$8,000 (two students @\$2,000 per year for four years) in National Legacy awards equaling \$15,600.


