The Staunton Elk Lodge 2021-22 Most Valuable Student Scholarship Program

The 2021-22 Most Valuable Student (MVS) Scholarship program has been completed. Of the twenty-six applicants, Staunton Elk Lodge #351 awarded nine students with scholarships ranging in value between \$1,000 and \$600 based on their ranked scores. As required by the rules of the MVS scholarship program, all applicants submitted their Most Valuable Scholarship applications on-line. Once the applications were received they were judged both nationally and locally based on an evaluation of the student's academic performance, an essay, leadership, financial need and community involvement. Upon completion of the judging the students were ranked. As is required by Grand Lodge, the three top male and the three top female applications were sent on to district/state competition based on their ranked scores. Unfortunately, Staunton Lodge did not have a State MVS winner this year.

The Staunton Elk Lodge Board of Trustees voted on a request by the Scholarship Committee to award scholarships to the applicants based on their ranked scores from the combined judging. Fortunately this year we were able to award the student scholarships in-person at their annual school awards program unlike the previous two years with COVID 19 restrictions. The total local dollar support for the 2021-2022 Staunton Lodge #351 MVS local scholarship program is \$6,200.

A special thanks is given to the local judges; Rob Lee, Steve Claffey, and Gary McQuain. They reviewed and judged each student's application and added quality points to the national score which ultimately determined which students moved on to state/district competition and the amount of the local award. They did an outstanding job in a very quick turnaround time frame in the month of December.
