Charlie and Vicki Drumheller delivered 11 pounds of tab tops to the Ronald McDonald House Charities in Charlottesville on Tuesday, August 17th. How many tab tops might that be, one may ask? Approximately, 12,408 tabs! That's a lot. Most all of the tab tops came from the Elks and the members.

So why tab tops and what does this do for the Ronald McDonald House? The tab tops have little odor and are denser than using whole cans. The charity sends the tab tops to a recycling company from which the proceeds are used towards the utility bills. Each house collects enough tab tops each year to provide about \$6000 that is used towards paying their utility bills.

We thank all the members who have contributed in any way. We encourage you to save your tab tops from home and bring them to the lodge. If you know of others who could provide extra tabs, collect them also.

The Ronald McDonald House provides free/low-cost lodging for family members of hospitalized patients undergoing serious procedures. Perhaps, you know of a family who has been the recipient of this very worthwhile charity.
