I converse with our vendors almost daily to keep up to date on current issues and pricing to ensure we can still offer quality product at an affordable price for our members. After the golf round, we will be serving pulled pork bbq cooked by Dan Doksa with baked beans and mac salad. The bbq and sides will also be available for purchase on the menu that evening for all members. The 351 will be preparing food for the Staunton Storm baseball team on April 18 and will be catering for the Cotillion on Saturday, April 29 in McCaffrey Hall.

As you have seen we have launched the spring menu at the lodge. I have also recently added a Chicago style hotdog to the menu, I offered it as a special one evening and ever since, people continue to ask for it so it is on the menu. We are now offering .75 wings on Saturdays from 12-9pm, in increments of 12 for dine in only.


